So, if we want, we can join in all the screaming and shouting. Maybe that would feel satisfying in some way. But things seems to be changing pretty rapidly in these days, and as we see things changing in our country, it might be better if we were to see who it is that benefits from the changes, and make note of that, and see who suffers from the changes, and find a way to serve those ones.

As I have thought about the best way for a Christian to live in our time, this is the plan that seems to be the closest to what I think Jesus would have us do. If you agree, maybe you could give some thought to how we as individuals, or as a church, could be about the business of bringing healing and relief to people who suffer.

In these interesting times, we dare not lose sight of who we are and who God calls us to be. We dare not lose sight of our leader and Savior, Jesus.

In 2025, Per Capita has increased to \$46.00 per active member.




Thank you, my dear friends, for all the hugs, well wishes, cards, and gifts you gave me when I






Our Youth Funday scheduled for February 2nd had to be postponed. Save the date for Sunday, March 23rd!!
