*First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world. Romans 1:8* **(NRSV)** 

As I write this, I am still clearing some of the cobwebs from fatigue and I don't know what else, following a mission trip to Belize that included 18 others from Hope Church. The words above were written by the Apostle Paul to the church in Rome, but I write them to you today. I want you to know that your faith was proclaimed in another part of the world this past week.

Nineteen of us travelled, but we took you all with us. We took your support, we took your prayers, and we took the confidence that we received through knowing you were with us. We thank you for the opportunity. And we are more than happy to share our experiences with you. But the thing I want you to be sure of is that every one of us, in one way or another, found a way to proclaim God's love for people. Every one. And you would have been especially proud of the younger ones among us. They engaged people and served them, and did so with joy.

If you have not travelled much, it might surprise you to learn that we have brothers and sisters all over the world. If you do travel, but don't spend time in the church abroad, it might not be clear to you that people of other languages, other races, other cultures, other levels of wealth and poverty—all of us—follow the same Christ and worship the same God, though, I will say that the worship can look quite different from the way it looks at Hope!

We see people finding ways to love and serve each other everywhere. We see the influence of Jesus everywhere, if we look. And if we try, we can see to it that our faith continues to be proclaimed throughout the world.


In 2025, Per Capita has increased to \$46.00 per active member.


## Christian Education Youth and Families "We love because God first loved us" 1John 4:19


