8 The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. 9 The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made. Psalm 145:8-9 (NRSV)

* approved the request to use Hopewood Chapel and sound system for the wedding of Datrianna Lynn Jensen and Brent Allen Mahn on June 21, 2025 to be performed by Larry Grahn.

THE FOOD PANTRY



In September, The Food Pantry served **180 Households**including 282 adults, 179 children and 58 seniors-distributing a total of 10,027 pounds of food!

CLIENT OUTREACH and HOUSEHOLD EXCHANGE



Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living.

In August, your donations were able to support **67 families** by helping with medical bills and prescription cost, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. The Link also provided **54 families** with basic household needs including clothing, dishes and

furniture!


